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Communities Committed to Excellence

- Rumson-Fair Haven was recognized as a **2011 National Blue Ribbon School** by the US Department of Education. The high school, accredited by the Middle States Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges and the NJ Department of Education, is a comprehensive high school of approximately 1000 students in grades 9-12.
- In 2021, *Common Sense*, the national nonprofit organization dedicated to helping kids and families thrive in a world of media and technology, recognized Rumson-Fair Haven Regional High School as a *Common Sense School*.
- In 2021, 99% of our students participated in extracurricular activities and/or athletics.
 - 28 graduating seniors representing 8 different sports, committed to play NCAA athletics for the fall of 2021.
- In 2021, RFH was recognized by *US News and World Report* among the top 10% of high schools in NJ and the top 6% of high schools in the US.
- In 2019, the *Washington Post's* "America's Most Challenging High Schools" ranked Rumson-Fair Haven #7 in NJ.
- The boroughs of Rumson and Fair Haven are residential communities located in northern Monmouth County, within forty miles of New York City and a mile of the Atlantic Ocean. A large proportion of the middle/upper class wage earners are college graduates who commute to NYC and are employed as professionals and business executives.

- **Our grading standards were not modified during the spring semester of 2020 due to the public health emergency, nor were they modified during the 2020-2021 school year.**
- **Honors, Advanced Placement, Dual Credit and Dual Enrollment** courses are **weighted** by one additional quality point in **GPA** calculation, as shown below.
- Our students continue to seek the **most challenging of post-secondary options** and the **rigor of Honors, AP, Dual Credit, and Dual Enrollment courses**. Their academic quality is further supported by standardized test scores noted on the following page of this profile.
- **All courses** taken at RFH (9-12) are included in GPA. Credits earned in other schools, enrichment programs and summer school grades, are listed on the transcript but are not included in GPA calculations.

Dual Enrollment with Brookdale Community College

25 Seniors participate in our Dual Enrollment Program. Classes are taken on the Brookdale Community College campus among the general BCC population. Participating seniors can earn 6 credits each semester. Courses are listed as Dual Enrollment in "Courses in Progress," and individually by course title under a separate heading of Brookdale Community College.

Internships noted on the transcript as Senior Project

9 Seniors participate in outside internships. These seniors have chosen to immerse themselves in a particular career experience in lieu of traditional elective courses. Their commitment in hours per week at their internship site is based on credit hours. They must submit quarterly papers and present a final cumulative project to a faculty panel and the project director.

Advanced Placement Data June 2021

- In 2021, a total of **519 AP exams** were administered to **265 AP test takers**. Of the students enrolled in AP courses, 73.2 % took the corresponding AP Test.
- Of the 265 AP test takers, there were **118 seniors, 138 juniors, 9 sophomores**.
- **195 (79 %)** Seniors have taken **1 or more AP courses** in their 4 years.
- **155 (63 %)** Seniors have taken **3 or more AP courses** in their 4 years.

Advanced Placement Scholars (85) June, 2021

Of the 85 AP Scholars, 71 were seniors and 14 were juniors.
