## Infractions and Actions

- Late to school (excessive) is the primary area of concern at RFH.
- Cutting study hall (period 9) and failure to attend central detention is an area of focus at RFH.
- Late to class and class cuts will continue to be addressed through progressive discipline. Student conferences are held with administration to review expectations and impact of excessive lates to school on academic performance.

**SSDS Incidents: RFH**

- Infractions include late to school, late to class, not signed in and failure to follow procedure.
- 414 on record; 115 students were involved in these incidents, and more than half of this total had only one infraction.
- Students who commit multiple file-type infractions are usually habitually late to school and/or class.

### **Efforts to address attendance issues:**

- Letters are generated at benchmark totals for lates and absences.
- Detentions, provisional credit, loss of credit
- Student conferences with administrator and or/counselor
- Parent contact via email, phone or conference
