Telehealth: A New Idea For Your Family Preparedness Toolkit

You probably never heard much about telehealth prior to 2020.

The very idea of receiving your health care via a mobile device or computer was simply not possible for most, especially since government and insurance company





regulations often opposed this option. Seldom has an issue changed so fast and convincingly as telehealth following the COVID-19 outbreak. An industry struggling to find mass acceptance and traction is now the "new normal" – all in a few dramatic months.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) defines telehealth, also known as telemedicine, as the use of electronic information and telecommunications technologies to support and promote long-distance clinical health care, patient and professional health-related education, and public health and health administration. The app will also provide users with up-to-date information on New Jersey reopening news, key COVID-19 metrics, and a user-friendly symptom tracking tool – all while maintaining privacy and anonymity between users.

URGENT INFORMATION FOR NEW JERSEY TENANTS DURING THE COVID-19

PANDEMIC - There is currently an eviction moratorium until December 27, 2020. That means that you cannot be evicted (locked out of your home) until after December 27, 2020, except in rare circumstances. This date may be shortened or extended by the Governor.1 - Rent is still due. If you can, you should continue to pay your rent in order to avoid eviction when the moratorium ends. - Even though there is an eviction moratorium, your landlord may still be able to file an eviction complaint against you in court. However, most landlord/tenant trials are currently on hold which means that most trials will not be scheduled until further notice. - Although most landlord/tenant trials are currently not taking place, some counties are scheduling virtual (online) settlement conferences between landlords and tenants to give landlords and tenants the opportunity to settle their cases. These settlements are VOLUNTARY which means that you DO NOT have to settle your case. If you do not want to settle your case, just tell the court staff that you do not want to settle and you can then leave the virtual conference. Your case will be set for trial when the courts start holding trials again. At that point, you may still have an opportunity to settle your case. - Unless the court finds that there is some kind of emergency, the eviction moratorium prevents lockouts until December 27, 2020 even if tenants have agreed to move out sooner and even when a non-emergency court order authorizes removal of a tenant. You should call the police if your landlord tries to lock you out or turns off your water or power to try to force you to leave. -You should seek legal advice if you have any questions regarding your rights as a tenant. If you cannot afford an attorney, you can contact a legal services organization such as Legal Services of New Jersey at (888) 576-5529, Volunteer Lawyers for Justice at (973) 943-4754, the Community Health Law Project (for individuals with disabilities) at (973) 275-1175, or the City of Newark's Office of Tenant Legal Services (if you are a Newark tenant) at (973)877-9424.

1 There is also a federal eviction moratorium which lasts through December 31, 2020, but you must meet very specific conditions and take certain steps in order to qualify. If the state eviction moratorium is not extended beyond December 27, 2020, the federal eviction moratorium may apply to you. If you have any questions about the federal or state eviction moratoriums, you should seek legal advice as specified above.

How To Get Tested For COVID-19 In New Jersey

Testing is available to everyone in New Jersey.

Our first responders and health care workers are saving lives every day - and so can you.

Do your part to protect yourself, your loved ones, and your community by getting tested for COVID-19.

You could have COVID-19 and not even know it. Find out if you have COVID-19 at any of the 250 testing sites across New Jersey.

It's quick and easy. You don't need insurance and free testing is available. Anyone who wants a test, can now get one.

It's especially important to get tested if:

- 1. You are experiencing symptoms (fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, sore throat, muscle pain, shivering, headache, or new loss of taste or smell)
- 2. You have been in close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19
- 3. You are an essential worker (health care worker, first responder, food service worker, or transit worker)
- 4. You were recently in a large crowd where social distancing was hard to maintain
- 5. You recently travelled to an area or a state with high COVID-19 infection rates

Monmouth County Application Information for Economic Assistance Grant Program

The Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders has dedicated \$10 million of its allocated CARES funding to support our community's small businesses and nonprofit organizations as they struggle to provide residents and visitors with their essential and exceptional goods and services during these unprecedented times.

Freeholder Director Tom Arnone continues to champion this program on behalf of the Board of Chosen Freeholders, "Small businesses and nonprofit organizations are the economic backbone of our community. Taking this extraordinary measure to provide them with direct financial assistance demonstrates Monmouth County's commitment to help ensure their short-term survival, recovery, and ultimate success."

The Monmouth County CARES Economic Assistance Grant Program provides financial support up to \$10,000 for those qualifying businesses, business owners, and nonprofits that do not exceed \$5 million in annual gross revenue and have experienced costly interruptions as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic.

Program Guidelines

In order to qualify for a Monmouth County CARES Economic Assistance Grant, applicants must meet the following criteria:



For Small Businesses/Business Owners

- Physically located in Monmouth County since January 1, 2019 or earlier
- Negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic
- \$5 million or less in gross revenue
- 50 or fewer full time equivalent (FTE) employees including the owner as of March 1, 2020
- It should be noted that banking, educational, governmental and medical service providers are not eligible for the grant program at this time.

Also, business must not operate in the following categories:

- "Adult" associated entertainment, goods, and services
- Vape and head shops
- · Other types of business establishments may be categorized as ineligible upon application review

For Nonprofit Organizations

- Physically located in Monmouth County since January 1, 2019 or earlier
- Provides a public service to beneficiaries residing in Monmouth County
- Negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic
- Registered with the IRS as a 501(c)3, 501(c)4, 501(c)6 limited to local and regional chambers of commerce, or 501(c)19
- May be a local affiliate of a larger state or national service organization

What you need to apply:

Before the online application process opens on Monday, August 3, 2020 at 8 a.m., all applicants should be prepared to submit the following information electronically through the application portal on the website:

- TIN/EIN This is your Tax Identification or Employee Identification Number. If a Sole Proprietorship without employees, you will need your social security number
- Legal Business Name
- DBA Doing Business As (if applicable)
- Business Contact Information (contact name, organizational role, e-mail address, phone number, and business address)
- NAICS Code of the Business: <u>North American Industry Classification System</u>
- Tax Returns: Fiscal years 2018 AND 2019 (if filed)
- Business Banking Information: routing and checking numbers
- Itemized list of eligible costs for reimbursement

Eligible Reimbursable Expenses:

Goods and supplies that were not part of the company's sellable merchandise:

- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) For customers and employees
- Personal sanitization supplies
- Disinfection and specialized cleaning supplies
- Protective barriers and installation Plexiglas walls
- Social distancing markers tape and signs indicating 6 foot distances/arrows for aisles
- Testing equipment and supplies including temperature check equipment



Technology costs of converting in-person business operations:

- New/additional merchant payment services
- Costs of website enhancements for interactive showrooms/storerooms
- Temporary technology to establish teleworking capabilities
- Cost to deliver or ship goods to customers.
- Inventory write-downs (i.e. spoiled food or expired, damaged, obsolete goods)

Personnel Costs:

- Employee training expense to ensure compliance with state and federal CDC guidelines for reopening
- Payroll costs, costs related to the continuation of group health care benefits during periods of paid sick, medical, or family leave, and insurance premiums
- Temporary staffing services to fill-in for staff on leave

Property Expenses (While business was closed):

- Rent Expense
- Utility payments
- Security services and equipment

Establishment of Temporary Sites and Conversion to Facilities:

- Construction and Materials If a business had to build anything new (i.e. patio, moving counters, etc.) to comply with social distancing regulations
- Fixtures/equipment updated sanitation devices (air cleaners), sanitation devices (like hand held steamers or whatever is approved)
- Furniture expenses related to investing in scope of business change (i.e. restaurant buying outdoor tables/tents/lighting)

Program Restrictions

 Funding cannot be used for reimbursements already made under other state and federal assistance programs (No Supplanted Funding)

Application Process

- Upon receipt of the application and required documents, each application will be reviewed for completeness and eligibility.
- Applications are on a first come, first serve basis
- Applicants will be notified if their application is incomplete
- Applicants will be allowed seven business days from the incomplete notification to resubmit missing
 or incomplete information in order to hold their place in the submission process.
- Upon resubmission, if the application information is still missing or incomplete, a new application will be required and accepted in the order it was received

- Students will order meals in homeroom and meals, both lunch and breakfast for the next day, will be delivered to the classroom for distribution.

Students 7-12

- Parents are encouraged to assist middle schoolers with pre-ordering meals at home the night before each in-person school day.
- At the conclusion of block 4, students will pick up their "to go" meals in the cafeteria as they exit the building. (Both lunch for the day and breakfast for the next day)
- Students will pick up their "to go" meals for their virtual days along with their same day meal order. All guidelines for free and reduced meals will be observed

Holmdel

Critical Area of Meals, Holmdel Township Schools will provide meals to free or reduced students who are learning remotely in the following ways:

- Meals will be distributed in bulk as grab and go packs on Mondays for several hours in the morning.
- Food service personnel and individuals picking up meals will be required to wear face coverings.
- Individuals picking up meals will be urged to maintain social distance while waiting to pick up their meals.

Howell

In cases where dining areas are adjacent to each other, students will be required to remain with their cohort group.

- Students will wear facial coverings when entering these group dining areas and while getting their lunch.

- Staff will be required to wash their hands after removing their gloves or after directly handling used food service items. In the Critical Area of Meals, Howell Township Public Schools will offer breakfast to students in grades PRE K Grade 8 in the following manner:
- •Students may receive breakfast from a cart.
- Students will wear facial coverings when approaching the cart.
- Students will not touch the food, but will be given wrapped items by food service personnel.
- Students will wear facial coverings when approaching the cart.
- Students will not touch the food, but will be given wrapped items by food service personnel.
- Students will consume breakfast in their first period class.
- Desks will be wiped down with disinfectant wipes following breakfast.

In the Critical Area of Meals, Howell Township Public Schools will provide meals to students who are learning remotely in the following ways:

- The following plan is pending approval from applicable agencies.
- Meals will be distributed in bulk as grab and go packs on Fridays for several hours in the morning.
- Meals will be distributed in the lobby of four school locations and via school buses which will stop at 31 stops in the more remote locations of the Township.
- Both breakfast and lunch meals will be included.
- Meals will be offered to all students, if allowable by waiver, but emphasis will be placed on notification to the student population who qualify for free or reduced meals.
- Food service personnel and individuals picking up meals will be required to wear face coverings.
- Individuals picking up meals will be urged to maintain social distance while waiting to pick up their meals.

Keansburg

Breakfast and lunch K-12 will serve lunch to all students on site utilizing "grab and go" stations. Distribution for students in school:

- Preschool lunch in classrooms with a "grab and go" breakfast."
- Caruso School, Bolger School and Keansburg High School meals will be given to students at the exit.

Distribution for students Remote Only:

There will be a 2 day pick up on Mondays and Wednesdays at their respective schools.



Little Silver

- Students will be provided with meals on a grab and go basis at dismissal.
- All food containers will be disposable. Hand sanitizer will be made available in food service and eating areas. All surfaces, tables and chairs will be sanitized and cleaned after lunch service.
- Lunch will be provided as "grab and go only". Meals served will not be intended
 to be consumed in the building and taken home. Unless for a self-contained class
 which can be eaten on premises in designated locations by building.
- Students will be dismissed in phases to accommodate social distancing and less traffic flow. The district will implement new meal period schedules to allow for full cleaning and any other directive required to be followed. Once the district moves to Phase 4 of the reopening process social distancing guidelines will be adhered to in lunch room spaces.
